Pastoral message from the Rector

Has anyone ever asked you questions like these: Do you speak in tongues? Do you prophesy? Do you have the gift of healing? Can you interpret tongues? These can be very confronting questions and are often asked by people who place great importance on the outward signs of the presence of the Holy Spirit. You can read more about these in today's reading in 1 Corinthians 12:1-13.

On some occasions people have been quite critical of me because I couldn't do some of these things, and it was like there was an expectation that, as a priest, I should have these abilities. However, if we look more closely at what St Paul actually wrote, he makes it quite clear that the gifts of the Holy Spirit are allocated to different people "as the Spirit chooses." So, we don't pick and choose our spiritual gifts. They are given to us as the Holy Spirit chooses to give them to us.

Today as we celebrate Pentecost, we read in the Acts of the Apostles how the Holy Spirit came upon the people when they were gathered together in one place, and suddenly there was mass amazement and astonishment because they were all hearing God's message in their own native languages. This caused such a disturbance that many people thought they must be drunk. The Holy Spirit has the capacity to disrupt lives, such as it did on that day, and it also has the capacity to fill us with deep peace. This was certainly the case for the frightened disciples in the locked room when the resurrected Jesus visited them.

At this frightening time of COVID-19, may you feel the peace of the Holy Spirit deep within you. May you also be aware of any gifts that the Holy Spirit has given you and may you use them generously, in humble service for others, so that through you, they may be drawn closer to God. Come Holy Spirit!

To minimise exposure to COVID-19 please do not use the postal system to deliver the form.

This system enables users to make regular weekly, fortnightly or monthly payments.
