### Pastoral message from the Rector

This Christmas is unlike any that I have experienced before. Usually by the time we get to Christmas Day, we would have had numerous services with large crowds and lots of singing of Christmas Carols. Unfortunately, COVID-19 stopped all that this year, and we are probably all feeling a bit flat as a result.

The Christmas story is one that is probably very familiar to many of us, but this year there is a part of the story that speaks to me in a new way, and perhaps it will for you too. I am referring to the acclamation from the angel to the shepherds, "Do not be afraid." I sometimes think these are easy words to say but perhaps less easy to follow. In our Australian culture, an equivalent may be to say to someone, "Don't worry about that." But what happens when someone is genuinely afraid, or worried. Simply telling them not to be afraid, or not to worry, may not be enough. It needs something else to allay that fear or worry.

So, what was it that allayed the fears of the shepherds and empowered them to hasten to Bethlehem? It was the presence of God. We see this in numerous accounts in the scriptures where people were afraid, but the presence of God allayed their fears. In addition to the angel greeting the frightened shepherds, we read of the angel visiting Mary who told her not to be afraid and later, the frightened disciples in the locked upper room were greeted by the risen Jesus who told them not to be afraid.

If this has been a year that has disturbed you, and perhaps others whom you know and love, and if you have a sense of anxiety, worry or fear about what next year might look like, can I remind you that God is with you and wants you to feel God's comforting presence. God has made his presence felt throughout history, sometimes in surprising ways, like talking through a burning bush as he did to Moses or speaking through the prophets as he did often. Whether it is an angel, a prophetic messenger, a voice, or simply a feeling, God will let you know that he is with you. Please spend some quiet time over this Christmas period being still and acknowledging God's presence with you. Even in these strange and sometimes fear filled times, we can still feel God's peace, and this helps to allay our fears.

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to God's people on earth.

## **The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according Luke.**

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see - I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord.
