Pastoral message from the Rector

When I was at school, I used to watch a television show called 'Mission Impossible'. It subsequently became a series of very successful movies by the same name. I loved the way they took something that seemed impossible and made it possible. The show was filled with intrigue and guesswork that kept the viewer on the edge of their seat until the last suspense filled moment. Even the music was suspenseful and stirring. I loved it.

The story of Mary's pregnancy could be seen by some to be a bit like a script for a Mission Impossible show. A young virgin woman becomes pregnant by the Holy Spirit and she gives birth to a baby boy. Her cousin Elizabeth, considered by many to be 'barren', i.e. well past childbearing age, also becomes pregnant, and the angel simply says, "Nothing will be impossible with God."

The Christmas story starts with the announcement by the angel to Mary that she has been chosen for this special 'mission'. She is never forced and after questioning and pondering, she gives her consent in the words, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." At any time, Mary could have said no, but she chose to say yes. This is an amazing moment in history and one that could easily be overlooked in the hype of Christmas festivities. A young woman agreed to be the vessel for God to use to bring God's son into the world. Her 'yes' allowed God to do something that many would call impossible.

I could not imagine what it would have felt like for Mary to consider such a request from God. I have never had anything of that magnitude to consider, and I sort of hope and pray that I never will. However, if God does require something of me, even if it seems impossible, I pray that I may have the grace, and the strength of faith, to be like Mary and say 'yes' to God. As our Prayer of the Day reminds us, Mary placed her life at the service of God's will. May we also be able to say 'yes' to God and accept God's will above our own, even if it seems impossible.
