Pastoral message from the Rector

This Sunday we are commemorating Defence Sunday. The following words come from Defence Anglicans:

“Defence Sunday is an opportunity for the whole church to pray for the ministry that occurs within and to the Australian Defence Force. Defence Sunday is important. Whilst Remembrance Day, coming up next Wednesday, recalls the tragedy of World War 1 and the hope for peace which came with the Armistice on 11 November 1918, the experiences of the past 100 years reveal that this hope remains unfulfilled. Tragically, Australian service personnel continue to die in combat in the Middle East and the numbers of physical, psychological and spiritual casualties continue to increase. Our church has a responsibility to provide ongoing pastoral and spiritual care to serving military personnel. The greatest support that the church can provide to its chaplains engaged in this mission is prayer and understanding.”

These are very moving words, and they speak to me of the ongoing need for prayer for peace and prayer for safety for all those who risk their lives in the quest for peace. You may know people who are connected with the defence forces, and this makes it even more personal.

Our Intercessory Prayers this week are compiled by Celeste Hartmann of our parish. Celeste is the mother of two current serving ADF personnel. Again, this makes it even more personal for all of us who know her.

Please continue to pray for all who serve in the quest for peace and for all Chaplains who care for serving ADF personnel.

Wearing of Face Masks Bishop Murray has advised of an update from NSW Health, who now only recommend masks where social distancing is not possible (e.g. public transport). The Minister and his medical advisor have both agreed that if congregational members are physically spaced at 1.5m, with no singing of course, then the risk of infection is so minimal, that the wearing of masks need no longer apply. Of course, some may wish to continue to wear masks to exercise caution and to show love to others. We should not discourage them, The Archbishop of Sydney continues to liaise on our behalf with Ministers and senior Health Department Advisers.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to John

Jesus said to the disciples, “Very truly, I tell you, the Son can do nothing on his own, but only what he sees the Father doing; for whatever the Father does, the Son does likewise. The Father loves the Son and shows him all that he himself is doing; and he will show him greater works than these, so that you will be astonished. Indeed, just as the Father raises the dead and gives them life, so also the Son gives life to whomever he wishes. The Father judges no one but has given all judgment to the Son, so that all may honour the Son just as they honour the Father. Anyone who does not honour the Son does not honour the Father who sent him. Very truly, I tell you, anyone who hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life, and does not come under judgment, but has passed from death to life. “Very truly, I tell you, the hour is coming, and is now here, when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God, and those who hear will live. For just as the Father has life in himself, so he has granted the Son also to have life in himself; and he has given him authority to execute judgment, because he is the Son of Man. Do not be astonished at this; for the hour is coming when all who are in their graves will hear his voice and will come out — those who have done good, to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil, to the resurrection of condemnation.
