Pastoral message from the Rector

Did you ever dream of finding hidden treasure? I know I did. When I was a child, I was a huge fan of Enid Blyton's books, especially The Famous Five. They always seemed to be having really exciting adventures involving pirates and hidden treasure. Whenever we went to the beach, I used to spend hours digging in the sand looking for valuables that people may have dropped. Sometimes I actually did find things, like coins, which made the search worthwhile.

In today's Gospel, Jesus likens the kingdom of heaven to buried treasure. He says it is so valuable that the person who found it sold everything they had to be able to buy the land and stake a claim on the treasure. Imagine getting rid of everything you own to buy one thing. It would have to be pretty valuable to go to those lengths. What price would we be able to put on eternal life? If the kingdom of heaven is like buried treasure, what would it be worth? What would we be prepared to pay for it?

Well, the good news is that for us, it is free. Jesus has already paid the price and all he asks of us is to believe, and he will open the door and we can have a place in his eternal kingdom. He is prepared to share the treasure with those who choose to believe in him. Is it any wonder that the psalmist is able to proclaim:

"O give thanks to the Lord and call upon his name: tell among the peoples what things he has done. Sing to him O sing praises: and be telling of all his marvellous works." Psalm 105:1

May we all discover the treasure of knowing God and sing God's praises and tell others of his marvellous works.

Romans 8: 26-39

The Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose. For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn within a large family. And those whom he predestined he also called; and those whom he called he also justified; and those whom he justified he also glorified. What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered." No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to Matthew

⁴⁴ "The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which someone found and hid; then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field. 45 "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls; 46 on finding one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had and bought it. 47 "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net that was thrown into the sea and caught fish of every kind; 48 when it was full, they drew it ashore, sat down, and put the good into baskets but threw out the bad. 49 So it will be at the end of the age. The angels will come out and separate the evil from the righteous ⁵⁰ and throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.⁵¹ "Have you understood all this?" They answered, "Yes." ⁵² And he said to them, "Therefore every scribe who has been trained for the kingdom of heaven is like the master of a household who brings out of his treasure what is new and what is old." 53 When Jesus had finished these parables, he left that place. 54 He came to his hometown and began to teach the people^[a] in their synagogue, so that they were astounded and said, "Where did this man get this wisdom and these deeds of power? ⁵⁵ Is not this the carpenter's son? Is not his mother called Mary? And are not his brothers James and Joseph and Simon and Judas? ⁵⁶ And are not all his sisters with us? Where then did this man get all this?" 57 And they took offense at him. But Jesus said to them, "Prophets are not without honor except in their own country and in their own house." 58 And he did not do many deeds of power there, because of their unbelief.
