Pastoral message from the Rector

I wonder if you can do as St Paul instructs the people of Thessalonica, when he says, 'Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances.' This is quite a challenge I think, especially when things are not going well.

I struggle sometimes to give thanks when things are really challenging, such as we are experiencing in these COVID-19 times. I also struggle to rejoice at these times. However, St Paul tells us that is exactly what we should be doing, so I will keep trying.

I remember sharing the story of Corrie Ten Boom in a sermon some time ago and I think the story is worth repeating. Corrie tells of the time she and her sister were prisoners in a prisoner of war compound. The soldiers were cruel and thought nothing of raping and killing the women prisoners. One day the women were moved into a new building which was infested with fleas. Corrie's sister said to the women that they must thank God for their new dwelling. They complained that it was a flea infested pit and there was nothing to give thanks for. However, Corrie's sister insisted, so they collectively prayed and sang hymns and gave thanks for their new dwelling. As time went on, the women discovered that the soldiers would not come into the building because of the fleas. It was the fleas that protected the women from being raped and kept them alive. "Give thanks in all circumstances" has a very powerful meaning when seen in this light.

I encourage all of us to spend time thinking deeply about these words from St Paul. They are very challenging but can also be very life giving. If we can find things to give thanks for, even in the midst of our darkest moments, then there is a light that shines in the darkness. This is called faith and it gives us hope. May you all find it within you to 'Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, and to give thanks in all circumstances.'
