SAINT FRANCIS OF ASSISI 4 OCTOBER 2020

Pastoral message from the Rector

Today we are celebrating the life of St Francis of Assisi. I think he is probably one of the most popular saints in the Christian church and is often referred to as the Patron Saint of animals. His story is inspiring as he reportedly gave up all material wealth and privilege to live among the poorest in his community. He literally trusted God to give him his daily bread.

Francis was known for his love of animals and all creation. He called the sun his brother and the moon his sister. He treated all creatures with respect and the words of the hymn, "All creatures of our God and King", written by William Henry Draper, are based on the 'Canticle of the Sun' of Francis of Assisi.

I think we can learn a lot from this humble saint, and I think we can especially learn much about how to care for God's creation. As I have reflected on my role in caring for this fragile but beautiful planet, I have begun to realise that even the smallest and simplest actions can have a profound effect. Earlier this year I planted eighteen grevillea trees in the rectory garden. They have now begun flowering and I am constantly delighted by the variety of colourful birds who now come into the garden to drink the nectar. The bees have found them too and my garden has been transformed from a plain, grassy open space to a growing 'small' forest of flowering trees providing life to some of God's creatures, especially the small ones.

The Fifth Mark of Mission of the Anglican Communion is: "To strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the life of the earth." I hope we can all be inspired by the life and example of St Francis of Assisi and I hope we may also be inspired to do our bit in caring for this beautiful planet that God has entrusted into our care.

<u>Angel Tree- A Prison Fellowship Ministry</u> Due to COVID-19 restrictions, Parish Council has made the decision to support Angel Tree in a different way this year. Angel Tree Ministry provides people with the opportunity to buy Christmas gifts for children whose parent is in prison. In previous years, our parishioners have supported this very generously, often providing more than 70 gifts per year. To ensure we can keep our parishioners as safe as possible, but also in the hope that we can still provide generously for these children, Parish Council is asking parishioners not to shop for presents this year but rather to consider making a donation to Prison Fellowship during the month of October. This will allow that agency to buy the gifts and deliver them to the relevant families in time for Christmas. The recommended value of a gift is \$30. Donations are also most welcome to assist with postage costs.

- 1. Place your donation in the Sunday offertory, either in the mission side of the envelope or in a separate envelope labelled Angel Tree.
- 2. Drop it in to the Parish Office.

<u>Wearing of Face Masks</u> As expected, the advice from the NSW Chief Health Officer Dr Kerry Chant (dated Sunday 2 August) is now specifically recommending the wearing of face masks in NSW during attendance at Places of Worship. Wearing a mask in this setting is not mandatory but it is highly recommended. Given that it is highly recommended Bishop Murray has suggested that face masks should be worn by all those attending a place of worship for the purpose of

worship or other group activities. This applies to ministers, worshippers, staff, volunteers, contractors or visitors, where there may be other people present; remembering that they are mainly intended to protect other people, not the wearer, from COVID-19 and that they are not a replacement for physical distancing and regular hand washing. Our recent Synod recommended that we continue to encourage the use of face masks at worship.


Bear each other's burdens
