THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD 10 JANUARY 2021

Pastoral message from the Rector

In the Anglican tradition, Baptism is considered one of our two primary sacraments, the other being Holy Communion. We have five other (or lesser as they are sometimes referred to) sacraments being in no particular order of priority: Marriage, Confirmation, Anointing, Confession and Ordination. I like to think of Baptism as being the beginning of a special spiritual journey.

Jesus himself was baptised and this marked the beginning of his ministry. Not much is known about him before his baptism, other than his birth and one account when he was about twelve years old when he got separated from his parents for several days. They eventually found him in the Synagogue with many of the learned teachers.

Mark's Gospel tells us that Jesus was baptised by John the Baptist, and after he came out of the water the Holy Spirit descended on him like a dove and a voice affirmed him as being God's Son, with whom God was well pleased. The passage goes on further to say that immediately after his baptism, the Spirit drove Jesus into the wilderness for a time of trial and testing. His ministry had begun.

Our baptism marks the beginning of our spiritual journey. Many of us will not actually remember the event because we may have been tiny babies, unlike Jesus who was probably closer to thirty years old. However, regardless of our age, baptism is a significant beginning in a journey that leads us into eternal life with God.

For me, it is important to try and listen to the voice of God to shape the way I live. I fail a lot, but I like to think that God knows that I try. Hopefully, God is well pleased with me, if not for my failings but at least for my ability to try. Do you think God is well pleased with you? I think this is something important for us to ponder on as we live into this new year.
