Pastoral message from the Rector

In today's Gospel, Peter is in trouble for expressing his concerns about Jesus and his impending suffering and death. Peter doesn't want his friend to suffer and he expresses this to him, only to be rebuked by Jesus. Why is Jesus so harsh in his rebuking of Peter?

Jesus is trying to tell his followers that the closer he gets to Jerusalem, the closer he gets to his death. However, the disciples don't fully grasp what Jesus is saying. Peter is the spokesperson for the group, so he takes Jesus aside and quietly rebukes him. The response is that Jesus rebukes him back, but openly in front of all the disciples. He then tells Peter that he is too earthly in his thinking and that he must set his mind on divine things. In other words, let God be in charge!

How often has that happened for you? Something happens and you immediately try to fix it by trying to change the course of action. The problem with this type of knee jerk reaction is that there has not been any time set aside to pray, to listen to God and to explore the possibility that perhaps this is the best course of action after all. It all depends on what God's plan is and how we play our part in allowing this to come to fruition.

If Peter had successfully stopped Jesus from going to Jerusalem, which is what he was trying to do; this is even more explicit in Matthew's account where Peter says "God forbid it, Lord! This must never happen to you." [Matt 16:22], then what would have happened to God's plan for salvation for all who choose to follow Jesus? I think this is why Jesus said, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me."

What part of 'self' do you think God may be calling you to deny this Lent? Is there some part of you that refuses to allow God's will to be done because it impacts on you, personally? If so, perhaps God is challenging you to 'deny yourself' and to take up your cross and follow Jesus. If this is an uncomfortable thought, then perhaps this is God's way of getting your attention, a bit like Jesus did with Peter.

Sermon

Nicene Creed:
