Changes to the Isaiah 61 Project in 2024

We are making some changes to the Isaiah 61 Project in 2024.

The biggest change is to our Monday afternoon outreach, which will end on 18 December. Giving out food vouchers is no longer the best way for us to support the most vulnerable people in our community. Instead of vouchers, we are exploring the introduction of a monthly breakfast on a Saturday morning at St Mary's. We anticipate we will feed 60 people at this breakfast.

Mission of the Month for November - Angel Tree

Angel Tree- A Prison Fellowship Ministry provides people with the opportunity to buy Christmas gifts for children whose parent is in prison. In previous years, our parishioners have supported this very generously, often providing more than 70 gifts per year. To ensure we can keep our parishioners as safe as possible, but also in the hope that we can still provide generously for these children, our parish mission for November is Angel Tree. Your donations will allow the agency to provide the gifts and deliver them to the relevant families in time for Christmas. The donations cover not only the cost of a gift but in many families the cost of postage.

There are three ways you can help bring Christmas Joy to the children of prisoners this year:

- Place your donation in the Sunday offertory in the mission side of the envelope or in a separate envelope labelled Angel Tree.
- Drop it into the Parish Office.
- Make a direct transfer to the Parish Account using Angel Tree as a reference.

The Rainbow Spirit Altar Frontal You may have noticed the altar frontal in St Mary's, decorated with the Aboriginal symbol of the Rainbow Spirit. This frontal has previously been used on occasions such as Aboriginal Sunday and NAIDOC Week. Until recently it was incomplete, but now that it has been finished it is a permanent sacred art work in our sanctuary (except for Advent and Lent).

The Rainbow Spirit depicted on the frontal is an important image for Aboriginal Christians. It is not an image of a literal snake. Early Christian missionaries

misunderstood this, and associated the image of a snake with the Fall in Genesis 3, and condemned it as evil. The Rainbow Spirit has been reclaimed by Aboriginal Christians as a powerful symbol of our Creator God, the eternal source of life.

In this Diocese we are working to encourage and foster reconciliation with the traditional owners of the lands on which we gather and worship. This Rainbow Spirit altar frontal is one way to show in a very visual way that we want to learn from and connect with the Bundjalung people. The frontal is an artwork created by two local Wiradjiri women who have been most generous in sharing their artistic gift with us.


ORGAN MUSIC AND A POEM


