ANNOUNCEMENT FROM REV CATHY

On Sunday 26 October I announced that I will be retiring and stepping back as rector of the Parish next year. My last working day will be Sunday 22 February. I will still live in Ballina, but I will not be able to worship with you for at least 12 months-those are the rules of the Diocese when a priest retires but continues to live in the parish.

I will still be involved in the life of the parish: running our Saturday BBQ breakfasts and our Christmas Day community lunch, and also leading the Threshold Singers - all on a voluntary basis.

I ask you please not to speculate about why I am retiring. I'm not going for health reasons. I'm not moving to the UK. It is a simple as this: in August God began to make it very clear to me that it was time to stop and rest and be refreshed. I wrestled with God over this until finally I understood that this meant retiring.

This parish has formed and shaped me, given me the most amazing opportunities to exercise God's call on my life. You have always supported me. I ask that in the coming months we continue to support one another with love, respect and with faith in our God. We don't know what the future holds, but God is already there, and we can face this time of change with confidence and trust that God is with us.
